Chapter One: A General Theory of Asylum Policy Making

Explores a state's capacity to restrict asylum flows and asylum flow sizes across regions to introduce a general theory of asylum policymaking.

Chapter Two: Knowledge of Job Insecurities and Policy Preferences

Studies how occupation-level job insecurities influence workers' policy opinions contingent on their knowledge of these insecurities.

Chapter Three: Firm Lobbying, Job Insecurity, and Policymakers' Votes for Trade Policies

Analyzes how state-level occupation distributions and firm lobbying influence policymakers' votes for trade policies.
